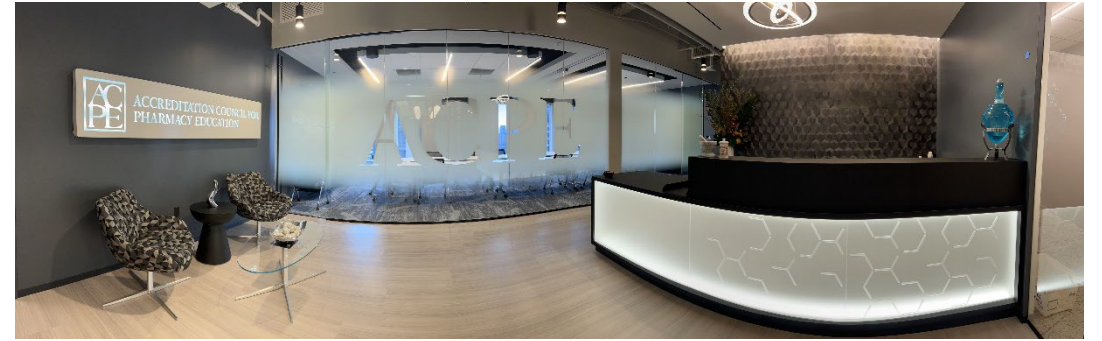

Update from January 2025 ACPE Board Meeting



January 2025 Board Meeting

- Board reviewed (colleges/schools):
 - 10 comprehensive evaluations for continued accreditation status (ETRs/ARs)
 - 1 focused visit evaluation (ETR/AR)
 - 27 Interim Reports
 - 70 Substantive changes
 - 20 Annual Monitoring responses
 - 19 complaints processed
 - 36 programs with a 10% decrease in annual budget
 - 44 programs reporting a net loss in annual budget for 2 consecutive years with 13 letters sent



January 2025 Board Meeting

- Post Board meeting, ACPE colleges/schools staff sent out 174 documents



Standards 2025



- Standards 2025 were finalized and approved by the ACPE Board of Directors on July 1, 2024
- Each school must be in compliance with Standards 2025 by July 1, 2025
- All Colleges and Schools has been asked to provide a “readiness” report for Standards 2025 to assist ACPE in monitoring compliance (exception: Fall 2025 comprehensive on-site visits)
 - Original due date was: April 1, 2025
 - Now extended to [June 1, 2025](#)
- Findings will be made available to each program after the January 2026 ACPE Board of Directors meeting.
 - Both the program’s responses and the Board’s response will be shared with the site team assigned to the program’s next comprehensive on-site evaluation to verify implementation of the plans

Standards 2025 – Next Steps

- Self-Study Workshop and Evaluator Training Workshop for Standards 2025 were offered summer 2024
 - Self-study training will be held July 23-24 at our office
 - Site team training will be held Sept 10-11 at our office (email Mary Kiersma for more info mkiersma@acpe-accredit.org)

- A webinar to update already trained site team evaluators on Standards 2025 will be available, soon
- AACP Assessment and Accreditation Management System (AAMS) has been discontinued for all self-studies beginning in fall 2025.
- ACPE Pharmacy Accreditation Report Management System (PHARMS) is operational and is replacing AAMS

Annual Monitoring/Website Data Requirements



- ACPE staff have been reviewing program websites for the published NAPLEX pass rates that are required to be posted (Policy 8.4).
- Please be reminded that all programs are required **to post a link to the NAPLEX passing rate data on the NABP Website** *in addition* to the most recent year's NAPLEX[®] results for first-time takers as reported on the NABP Website, on-time graduation rates and a measure of student achievement for the most recent graduating class as determined by the program.

Annual Monitoring/Website Data Requirements



- Our audit revealed that 110 out of 141 schools failed to comply with posting the NABPLEX passing rate data <https://nabp.pharmacy/wp-content/uploads/NAPLEX-Pass-Rates.pdf>
 - Reminder sent in the Dear Dean letter that was sent out last week and is published on our website
 - Please remember to update your website with the current 2024 results no later than April 1st

Changes in Annual Monitoring



- As of June 2024, the Board reviews trends in the overall number of first-time test takers failing the NAPLEX examination at each program.
 - Programs with a large number of failures (defined as >30), yet still having an overall passing rate above the two standard deviation threshold, may be asked to identify the causes of such failures and provide action plans for reducing the number of first-time test takers failing the examination.

Changes in Annual Monitoring



- Within any seven-year period (policy 11.6.1.a):
 - 1st year passing rate below 2SD: *letter* sent requiring root cause analysis for poor performance and action plan for improvement
 - 2nd year passing rate below 2SD: *focused on-site evaluation* to explore program's compliance with accreditation standards
 - 3rd year passing rate below 2SD: program requested to *meet* with ACPE Board of Directors
 - 4th year passing rate below 2SD: program subject to *probationary* action
 - 5th year passing rate below 2SD: program subject to *withdrawal* of accreditation

Faculty Strength and Expertise



- National declines in applications and enrollment have led to decreases in program resources including faculty composition and strength
- ACPE stresses the need to ensure resources including faculty strength are maintained to meet program needs
 - Standards 10,18,19 require a sufficient cohort of faculty with academic credentials and expertise to deliver the curriculum
- To aid the Board in monitoring faculty cohorts including adjunct faculty at each program, *reporting on current faculty cohorts and expertise will be added to the annual monitoring policy* beginning in July 2025
- More details will be shared regarding this requirement shortly after the June 2025 Board meeting

 - ACPE-accredited providers who use the term Certificate Program where the program does not meet the ACPE Standards and Policies must include a disclaimer: ***'This is not an ACPE-defined Certificate Program; learners who complete this course will receive ACPE CPE credit but will not be awarded completion of a Certificate Program.'***

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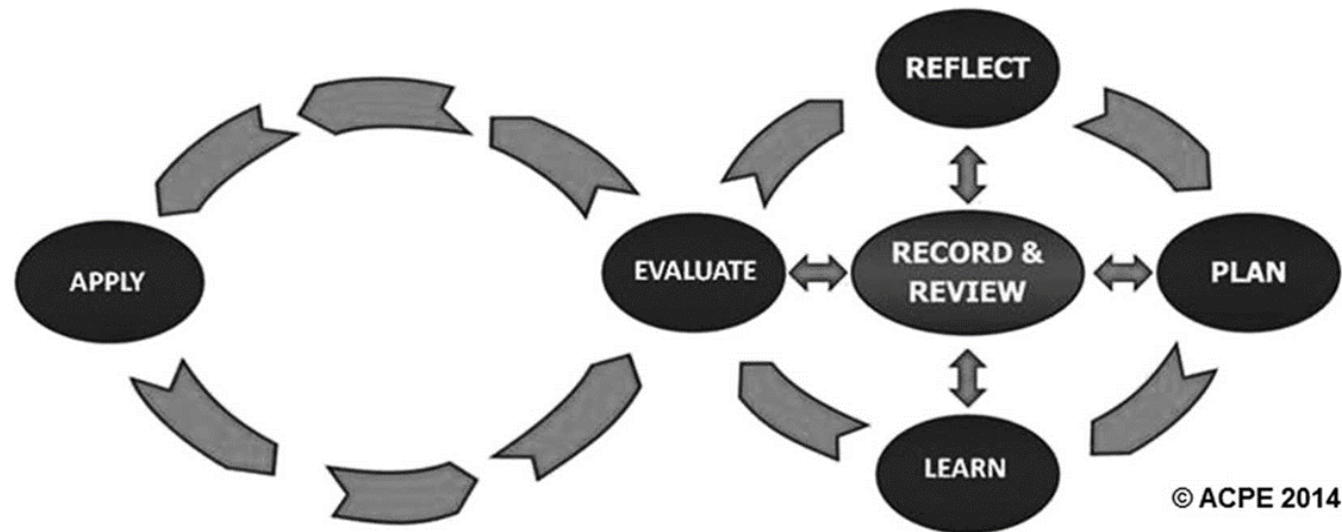
Healthcare Continuing Education Professionals Day™

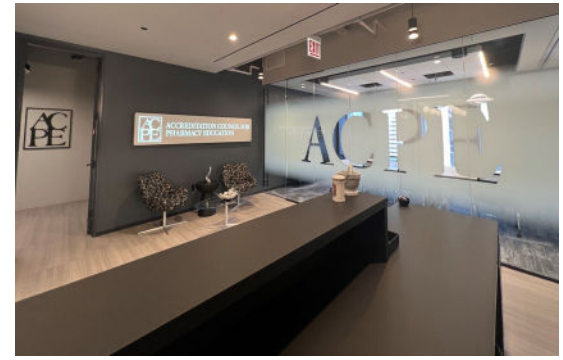
